Comparison of factors facilitating reform

A. Initial Conditions:	 Estonia: Vibrant civil society; clean break from communism Romania: New government still connected to old regime
B. Distribution of Resources:	 Estonia: Inclusive privatization; economy opened up quickly Romania: Privatization lead to concentration of resources and delayed liberalization
C. Transparency:	 Estonia: Media freedom and e-government Romania: Freedom of Information Law promoted by EU helped civil society
D. State capacity:	 Estonia: New judges were chosen based on merit Romania: Stop-and-go reforms but some improvement
E. Role of the EU:	 Estonia: EU provided benchmarks for high standards Romania: EU membership acted as a catalyst for reforms

Key messages

- Strengthening institutions a priority for next generation of reforms
- Some countries successfully reformed, though reversals also occurred
- Distributional factors key to successful judicial reforms; privatization and opening up had notable effects
- Strengthened transparency and accountability conducive to improvements in judicial effectiveness
- The quality of the public administration was another critical factor
- The EU was a strong external anchor but sustainability of reforms appears to depend manly on domestic factors
